Please note: USEF's new rule:

DR120.5 At any time while mounted on the competition grounds, all riders under age 18, all riders while on horses competing in national level tests, all riders competing in Para-Equestrian tests, and all riders while on non-competing horses, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. When a horse is competing in both national and FEI levels or tests (e.g. Fourth Level and PSG), the rider must wear protective headgear at all times when mounted on that horse on the competition grounds and during all tests. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Any other exhibitor may wear protective headgear at any level of competition without penalty from the judge. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tail coat (only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hatcovers (where applicable) and must otherwise conform to DR120 (see GR801).

SHOW RULES and GENERAL INFORMATION

Dressage in Bishop – Almost Summer Dressage Show is covered by the rules and specifications of the current US Equestrian Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. You may view the current rules on-line at www.usef.org.

1. All fees must be included on your check and paid prior to show number being received on day of show. No refunds after closing date for any reason.
2. Entries will be accepted on a First-Come, First-Served basis. Entries are not considered complete until all signatures are complete, memberships are verified and payment is complete.
3. Post entries are allowed on a space available basis only, prior to the start of the class and after all forms have been completed, signatures obtained and fees paid. All changes after the date of entry closing are considered late/post entries. There is an additional charge of \$25 for late/post entries.
4. A copy of a current CDS membership card must accompany each entry for rider, owner and trainer. **Western Dressage competitors do not need to be CDS members.** Amateurs: A copy of your USEF amateur card must also accompany your entry. See **Amateurs, Jr/Young Rider** information below.
5. In the event that all or part of a competition is cancelled due to a storm, accident or other emergency, the competition will not be responsible for refunding entry, stabling, office or any similar fees for the cancellation class or classes. If the show must be cancelled, Show Management will exercise their best efforts to reschedule the show at a later date.
6. CDS non-member rule: For CDS recognized shows in California, Nevada, Arizona and Oregon, CDS agrees to a reciprocal non-member system where CDS will waive the non-member fee IF the competitor and/or owner is a member of another USDF GMO, and in return, the show management will not charge CDS members a non-member fee for any other GMO. If the competitor and/or owner is not a member of CDS or other GMO, then the show management will charge and collect non-member fees for CDS. Note: Cowboy Dressage competitors are exempt from this rule.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. It shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold harmless the Horse Show and its Directors for any loss or accident to their horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise. Each competitor, trainer, owner, is responsible for any damages incurred by them to the horse show facilities.

1. Show Management reserves the right to arrange for additional judges and to cancel, combine or amend any class, including but not limited to class awards, scheduling and location.
2. Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, without claim or damages.
3. Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to. or arising

out of, or incident to the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered by these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Show Management and such determination shall be final.

4. Show Management shall disqualify any person who acts or incites others to act in a manner contrary to CDS Rules or in a manner deemed improper, unethical, dishonest, or unsportsmanlike

5. NO PHONE entries will be accepted. All entries must be made **on official entry blanks and filled out completely as to classes, exhibitor's/owner's, trainer's, name, address, phone number(s), association number(s), and signatures.** Parents or guardians must sign the official entry blank of a minor before a number will be released.

6. Faxed entries (818 487-9121) will be accepted until closing day, Friday, July 8th, as long as the check covering show fees is received by Monday, July 11th, – NO LATER. If check arrives after July 11th, a \$25 late fee will be assessed. If check is not received by Friday, June 15th, entry will be returned.

7. Who to notify in case of emergency is vital information for horse show management – please supply this information.

AMATEURS, JUNIORS, YOUNG RIDERS

Amateurs are defined by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book. **All riders in Amateur Divisions must present a copy of their USEF Amateur Card when picking up their number or they will not be allowed to show in the Amateur Division. If an Amateur card was applied for but not yet received, a copy of proof of application must be given provided prior to competing.**

Cards may be applied for at the show office.

1. Individuals possessing current amateur certification are eligible as Adult Amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22.

2. Individuals are eligible as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year they reach the age of 21.

3. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parents(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

4. All minors/juniors must be supervised by their parent/guardian or authorized agent at all times while at or on the show grounds, whether riding or on foot. The parent/guardian or authorized agent shall assume all responsibility to protect juniors from any injury, damage, harm and/or loss and shall indemnify, defend and hold CDS, the facility, show management and volunteers harmless therefrom.

TIMES: Will be e-mailed where possible **AND** posted on www.bishopdressage.com. PLEASE SUBMIT A LEGIBLE E-MAIL ADDRESS. ALL RIDERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR SECURING THEIR RIDE TIMES PRIOR TO THE SHOW. Ride times will be posted at the show grounds the day before the show.

Note: In order to meet scheduling needs, classes may not always be scheduled in order of difficulty. If you have any particular scheduling needs, we will attempt to accommodate our competitors, however, there is no guaranteed your request can/will be fulfilled.

SCRATCHES: Exhibitors have the responsibility of informing the Show Office of their intention to scratch. Scratches before the closing date may be made for any reason and all fees will be refunded. If you decide to scratch any of the classes after the closing date, you must inform show management. **NO REFUNDS, INCLUDING STALL FEES, AFTER SCRATCH DATE FOR ANY REASON.**

GROUNDS FEE: \$15 per day. All horses/mules not being stabled at Millpond and trailering in for the show are required to pay a grounds fee.

STABLING: Limited stabling available. Box Stalls (full-service) \$35 per day (one bag of shavings included/Stalls have top-doors). Additional bags of shavings available for purchase for \$9.00 per bag. Pipe paddocks \$25 per day. For stabling information and for stall reservations, please call Hilke Ungersma at Millpond Equestrian Center (760) 873-6037.

ARENAS: Warm-up arena is sand. 20m x 60m competition arena is sand mixed with rubber chips.

LUNGE: In designated areas only.

TESTS: The Current USEF, FEI tests will be used.

AWARDS: Ribbons thru 5th. Prizes to 1st in classes of 3 or more. O, A/A and, Jr/YR classes will not be combined for awards.

ACCOMMODATIONS: See website for list of area hotels.

Food will be available on show grounds.

No dogs on show grounds.

In the event of rain prior to show, it is the rider's responsibility to call to determine whether show is cancelled. Show will not be cancelled unless footing deemed unsafe.

On-call veterinarian and farrier phone numbers posted in the show office.

Bridle number must be worn at all times when the horse is out of the stall at the competition.

Any disputes concerning scores, divisions entered, and/or placings must be brought to the attention of the Show Office within one hour of the end of the show day. Scores and placings become final at that time. Competitors will not be allowed in or around the arena while a class is in progress or inside the arena at other times except under the following conditions: Management will post and/or announce in advance designated times competitors may school inside the arena(s).

All Owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents, employees or animals to stall buildings and other properties on the show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. All bills for veterinary, farrier services and feed are due and payable during the show. The Management reserves the right to deduct any unpaid veterinary, farrier and feed bills from premium, stake or prize money, or refunds due the exhibitor. Any exhibitor not meeting obligations to the official veterinarian, farrier or feed supplier will be termed an undesirable exhibitor and entries from that exhibitor may not be accepted at subsequent shows.

Owner/Agent/Participant agrees that if stabling is provided, Show Management is merely providing stabling for the convenience of the participant and management and sponsoring organizations shall have no responsibility whatsoever for any injury, loss, damages, etc., as a result of using said stabling. Owner/Agent/Participant agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold Show Management, their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers and affiliated organizations harmless from any loss, damages or claims as a result of said use. **Owner/Agent/Participants/Exhibitor/Rider assumes all care, custody and control with regard to this use.**

Competitors are responsible for all insurance for themselves, employees, owners, horses, etc. Competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, agents or horses. They are strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to keep the policy current.

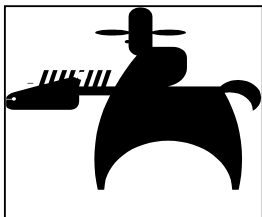

I AGREE to indemnify (that is, to pay any losses, damages, or costs incurred by) the Federation and the Competition and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse while at the Competition. I have read the Federation Rules about protective equipment, including GR801 and, if applicable, EV114, and I understand that I am entitled to wear protective equipment without penalty, and I acknowledge that the Federation strongly encourages me to do so while WARNING that no protective equipment can guard against all injuries. If I am a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, I consent to the child's participation and AGREE to all of the above provisions and AGREE to assume all of the obligations of this Release on the child's behalf I represent that I have the requisite training, coaching and abilities to safely compete in this competition.

I AGREE that if I am injured at this competition, the medical personnel treating my injuries may provide information on my injury and treatment to the Federation on the official USEF accident/injury report form.
